## **Eagle River Golf Course Player Rules**

- 1. All players must pre-pay or check in and pay at the pro shop before the start of a round.
- 2. All players must start on the starting hole indicated by the pro shop staff.
- 3. 18-hole players have priority on the 10<sup>th</sup> hole for turning after #9. No 9-hole starting on hole #10 unless approved by the pro shop staff.
- 4. If there is a group only playing 9 holes, it is possible based on demand, that a new 9-hole group could be started on the second 9 in their spot.
- 5. Singles will be paired up with other two and threesomes on the tee sheet. Open tee time blocks will not be reserved for one player.
- 6. Players must keep pace at all times. Play ready golf and keep up with the group in front of you. Our goal is to have play take no longer than 2 hours and 10 minutes per 9 holes during busy play periods.
- 7. An adult of at least 18 years old must be in a group to rent carts and any driver of a cart must have a valid driver license to operate a golf cart.
- 8. Golf carts are to be kept outside of the orange lines by the greens. Obey all cart signs.
- 9. Use the 90-degree cart rule from the cart paths as conditions dictate.
- 10. Shoes and shirts are required for all players and guests.
- Our general policy is foursomes only. In certain circumstances to make play flow at a smoother pace, players may be joined up into a fivesome by the ERGC staff, but if that fivesome falls behind, they will be split up. Exceptions to the foursomes only policy is at the sole discretion of the ERGC Golf Staff!
- 15. All food and beverages must be purchased at the clubhouse or from the service cart.
- 16. Range baskets and range balls must stay on the practice range. Playing on the course with range balls in your bag is prohibited. Please throw balls you find outside of the range boundaries back onto the range.
- 17. Please replace divots and repair ball marks on the greens. Strive to leave the course in better shape than you find it.
- 18. Players not following these rules are subject to removal from the course without refund.

"Golf is played, for the most part, without the supervision of a referee or umpire. The game relies on the integrity of the individual to show consideration for other players and to abide by the Rules. All players should conduct themselves in a disciplined manner, demonstrating courtesy and sportsmanship at all times, irrespective of how competitive they may be. This is the spirit of the game of golf."
